Subject: Third Quarter 2009 Stevenson House Status Report

On September 30, 2009, with a population of 46 the Stevenson House was 16 percent under capacity. The capacity of 55 beds was not exceeded.

Admissions: There were 100 admissions to the Stevenson House during the third quarter of 2009.

Admission demographics: Of the 100 admissions, 31 were females and 69 were males. During the third quarter 63 African Americans, 37 were admitted to the Stevenson House.

Leading charges at admission: The most frequent leading charges at admission for the third quarter were violation of probation, 16; assault in the second degree and burglary in the third degree, 7. Thirty-nine youth, or 39 percent, were admitted to the Stevenson House for violent felonies.

Length of stay: There were 46 youth at the Stevenson House with an average length of stay (LOS) of 60 days and a maximum LOS of 331 days on September 30, 2009.

Of the 46 youth, there were 29 Family Court youth with an average LOS of 27 days, and 17 Superior Court youth with an average LOS of 115 days.

Snapshot demographics: Of the 46 youth on September 30, 6 were female and 40 were male. There were 26 African Americans and 20 whites.


Youth's status: There were 34 detained and 12 adjudicated youth on September 30, 2009.

Releases: 102 youth were released during the third quarter of 2009 with an average LOS of 31 days, and a maximum of 273 days.




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Snapshot populations are taken at the end of any given month.

Reading this table: This table shows that 42 percent of youth admitted to the Stevenson House Stevenson House during the third quarter of 2009 had prior admissions to secure detention, 13 percent to Level V, 28 percent to Level IV, and 54 percent to Level III. Twenty-four of the 58 youth without prior detention admissions had prior admissions to Levels III, IV and/or V.
