

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

*Crime in Delaware* is the official report of serious crime known to Delaware law enforcement agencies. This report provides information about 22 Violent, Serious Property, Drug/Narcotic and Other Property and Social offenses reported in Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) operated by the State Bureau of Investigation of the Delaware State Police. Final data for the years 2009 through 2012 and preliminary data for 2013 are included in this report. Also, as appropriate, final data for the years 2002 through 2008 are included in the data charts to illustrate long term trends.

The report includes a summary of data on serious offenses, clearances, adult and juvenile arrests, and crimes against law enforcement officers at the state and county levels, followed by a detailed data section organized by state and county.

## Key Findings/Trends

**Overall, the occurrence of serious crime has decreased notably since 2009.** The number of serious criminal offenses known to police in 2009 was 98,059 compared with 93,756 in 2012, a decrease of 4.4%. Preliminary data for 2013 suggest that pattern is continuing, with the number of offenses at just over 88,000, a decline of about 9% compared to 2009.

**Violent crime in the State decreased more than 15% from 2009 to 2013,** with a marked decline in reported Violent Offenses in 2013, following a gradual decline over the previous four years.

**The number of Homicides in 2013 (44) was comparable to 2009 (43),** but markedly lower than 2010, 2011, and 2012 (49, 51, 58 respectively).

**Serious Property Offenses decreased 3% between 2009 and 2013,** although motor vehicle-related theft offenses and Burglary offenses decreased around 30% and 10% respectively, while Shoplifting and Theft From a Building offenses each increased by about 15%.

**Drug/Narcotic Offenses increased about 16% between 2009 and 2013.** This reflects a substantial increase in offenses in 2013 after a gradual decline over the previous four years.

**Other Property and Social Offenses decreased around 18% between 2009 and 2013.** There has been a steady decline in this offense category over the past five years.

**Two of the most frequently reported crimes – Assault offenses and Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property offenses – showed distinct downward trends from 2009 to 2013.**

Based on 2013 preliminary data, **offenses in all crime categories were cleared by law enforcement officers at rates comparable to or better than the rates from 2009 through 2012.** Overall, 53.2% of offenses in 2013 were cleared by the end of the calendar year.

**Violent crime against law enforcement officers decreased by about 6% between 2009 and 2013.** No officers were killed in 2013, but 17% of the 470 assault-related offenses committed against officers resulted in injuries.

# INTRODUCTION

*Crime in Delaware* is the official report of serious crime reported to Delaware law enforcement agencies. This report covers data on serious crimes that were reported to Delaware's state, county, and local police agencies for the years 2009 through 2013.

The report is divided into the following sections:

- A summary of serious crime data at the state and county levels;
- A detailed data section with information about serious offenses, clearance rates, arrests, law enforcement agency staffing, and violent crimes committed against law enforcement officers.
- A set of tables for select serious crimes for 2012 and 2013 broken out by jurisdiction.
- A Technical Appendix with a detailed discussion of clearance rates, along with a glossary of crime definitions and National Criminal Information Center (NCIC) crime codes.

*Crime in Delaware 2009-2013* continues the changes made in the previous report to the statistical methodology and to the design of the report to make information easier to find, understand, and use. Please see *Crime in Delaware 2008-2012* for a detailed discussion of those changes.

*Crime in Delaware* provides data about the 22 Group A Offenses reported in Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). These offenses include Drug/Narcotic Offenses and 21 other specific crimes/crime categories listed below:

# METHODOLOGY

## Data Sources

Data for this report were drawn from two sources:

- The State Bureau of Identification (SBI) of the Delaware State Police, which maintains Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (which, for simplicity, is referred to as 'NIBRS' in the data section of this report), from which offense, clearance, arrest, and crimes against law enforcement officers statistics are derived. SBI is also the source of law enforcement agency staffing numbers.
- The Delaware Population Consortium, from which state and county population figures are drawn.

Preliminary Delaware NIBRS data reports for 2013 were downloaded from the Delaware Department of Technology and Information secure document library on April 24, 2014. In accordance with the statistical refinements discussed below, the final data report for 2012 was downloaded on March 12, 2014.

## Preparing the Data for Inclusion in *Crime in Delaware*

### *Checking Data Quality*

NIBRS data are not automatically drawn from criminal incident reports filed by participating law enforcement agencies. Because each state has its own set of criminal statutes, offense names and definitions vary from state to state. To allow data from states to be examined at a national level, each jurisdiction participating in NIBRS must assign each offense a common NIBRS code before entering and submitting data to the system. This extra set of steps introduces opportunities for data errors and requires a process for checking data quality.

Having crime data that is reasonably accurate and complete is essential for producing the *Crime in Delaware* report. To ensure that the data were sufficient for use in this report, validation checks were conducted to identify any issues of concern related to data completeness and accuracy. Since the State Bureau of Identification conducts extensive data quality and review control procedures (as do the Dover, New Castle County, and Wilmington Police Departments) prior to submitting NIBRS data to the FBI, it only is necessary for the Delaware Statistical Analysis Center to perform a more limited set of validation checks.

Validation checks conducted for the 2013 preliminary and 2012 final data reports indicated these data were of sufficient quality and completeness for use in the *Crime in Delaware* report.

## *Preparing and Transforming Data*

Single year NIBRS data reports prepared by SBI are not in a production-ready/user-friendly format, nor do they contain the various statistics (differences, crime rates, percentages) that *Crime in Delaware* includes. These data reports, downloaded as text files, were imported to Microsoft Excel before undergoing a cleaning and transformation process so that the data could be collated across years and examined at the state and county levels using appropriate computations and calculations.

## **Statistical Refinements**

*Crime in Delaware* has undergone statistical refinements from time to time for a variety of reasons, including to account for changes in the data that are available for use in the report, to reflect changes in the way crime data are reported by other entities, and as a result of periodic reflection to enhance the usefulness and value of the report. In 2013, *Crime in Delaware* entered a period of transition. The Delaware Statistical Analysis Center elected to use that transition as a natural opportunity to reflect on how *Crime and Delaware* might be improved.

This process of reflection resulted in several statistical refinements for the 2008-2012 report (please see *Crime in Delaware 2008-2012* for a detailed discussion of the refinements), including:

- *Standardizing the reference periods for prior year data.* Delaware's NIBRS data for a given year are considered to be final for *Crime in Delaware* reporting purposes 12 to 15 months after the end of the reporting year, when the data are sufficiently stable.
- *Alterations to the way change over time is examined and reported.* Final data are statistically compared only with final data and preliminary data for 2013 are only compared with preliminary data from prior years. Graphs that present final data from prior years and preliminary data from 2013 are included to illustrate general trends in crime data over time.

For the current report, two additional changes were made:

- *The time period covered by the trend graphs was expanded to include the years 2002 through 2008.*
- *A '2002-2012 Average' line for offenses is included in most trend graphs.*

Both additional changes are intended to provide the reader with more information about crime trends in ways that are easy to understand and appropriate to the nature and limitations of the data.

## Notes and Important Considerations

Data in this report reflect only the serious crimes known to police (i.e., have been reported to the police or that police have observed). Some serious crime incidents are never reported or detected. Other serious crime incidents may only be reported or detected months or years after they occurred. The numbers in this report should, therefore, be considered as a floor estimate – that is, there was at least as much serious crime as noted in this report, likely more. Less serious offenses, for which NIBRS only contains arrest data, are not included in this report.

**Caution should be used in drawing conclusions** about changes in the occurrence of serious crime based on the data in this report. The following considerations should be kept in mind:

- ***NIBRS data reflect the number of offenses/charges rather than unique criminal incidents.*** A single criminal incident can result in a single charge filed by police or multiple charges depending on what criminal behaviors occur during the incident and the characteristics of the incident itself (e.g., the number of victims and alleged offenders).
- ***Be careful when comparing 2013 crime data to final crime data from prior years.*** For the reasons discussed earlier, 2013 crime data will not become sufficiently stable until early 2015. As a result, conclusions drawn about crime differences of 4% or less may no longer be valid once the 2013 data are final.
- ***Crime Rate figures (i.e., the number of crimes per 1,000 people) are best viewed in the context of other crime and population data.*** The Crime Rate reflects not just the change in the number of offenses known to law enforcement officers but the change in the population as well. Even if the number of offenses has not changed from one year to the next, changes in population will make it appear that crime has decreased (in the event of a population increase) or that it has increased (if the population decreases). The Crime Rate, when used by itself, can create a distorted picture of crime.
- ***Use caution in comparing jurisdictions, counties, and states.*** Differences in community socioeconomic factors, population trends, and how law enforcement agencies operate (in charging practices when an arrest is made; in interpreting crime definitions; in enforcement priorities, etc.) can vary greatly among communities, all of which create challenges in making accurate and valid comparisons. Also, participation in NIBRS is voluntary and not all states choose to participate; even among many states that do, not all jurisdictions elect to take part. Where crime data for a state are not complete, the FBI must create estimates to account for those data gaps.

The FBI says it best in the introductory note to its *Preliminary Annual Uniform Crime Report, January-December, 2012*<sup>1</sup>:

“Individuals ... are cautioned against drawing conclusions by making direct comparisons between cities. Comparisons lead to simplistic and/or incomplete analyses that often create misleading perceptions adversely affecting communities and their residents. Valid assessments are possible only with careful study and analysis of the range of unique conditions affecting each local law enforcement jurisdiction. It is important to remember that crime is a social problem and, therefore, a concern of the entire community. The efforts of law enforcement are limited to factors within its control. The data user is, therefore, cautioned against comparing statistical data of individual agencies.”

### **A Note About Clearances/Clearance Rates**

In crime analysis, the federal definition of *clearance rate* is the percentage of offenses received that are 'solved' through an arrest or by exceptional means. An offense is 'cleared by arrest' for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to a court for prosecution.

In certain situations, an offender is known but is not or cannot be arrested and formally charged. When this happens, the offense can be cleared by *exceptional means*. Such situations include, but are not limited to, offender death or confession; an offender who cannot be extradited from another jurisdiction; refusal of a victim to cooperate in a prosecution; handling a juvenile offender through an alternative police policy.

It is important to keep in mind that the arrest or identification of one offender may clear multiple offenses. Alternatively, multiple arrests may clear only a single offense.

A more detailed explanation of clearances and clearance rates can be found in the Technical Appendix at the end of this report.

## SERIOUS CRIME AT-A-GLANCE

This section of the report provides summary-level data about serious crime in Delaware and in the state's three counties for the years 2009 to 2013. Included in this section are data about the total number of serious offenses and the four major categories of crime: Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug Offenses, and Other Property and Social Offenses.

The specific topics addressed in this section are as follows:

- offenses received by law enforcement agencies;
- offense clearances;
- crime rates;
- differences in the number of offenses received between years;
- total arrests and arrests of adults and juveniles; and
- assaults against law enforcement officers.

All state-level summary data, organized by the topics above, are presented first. All summary data, again organized by topic, are then presented for each county. More detailed data about offenses and clearances, arrests, and assaults against law enforcement officers can be found in the '...Detailed Look at Serious Crime...' section beginning on page 30.

### **Note to the reader**

Data for a calendar year are not considered final for the purposes of the *Crime in Delaware* report until offense counts become sufficiently stable, usually 12-15 months after the end of that year. Therefore, final data are provided for the 2009-2012 period and preliminary data for 2013.

*In calculating differences between 2013 and previous years, preliminary data were used for all years (although preliminary counts for 2009-2012 are not provided in this report). Doing so removes the distortion inherent when computing statistical differences using preliminary and final data. Such distortion can make such differences appear larger or smaller than they actually are. Final data are used for comparisons between the years 2009 through 2012. However, graphic figures that plot final and preliminary counts are include as appropriate to illustrate trends in the data. Visual portrayals of this type of data are useful and are much less susceptible to distortion than statistical differences.*

As noted earlier in this report, please use caution when comparing Delaware's data to national data or those for other states. Crime data, particularly crime rates, are best understood in the context of other data.

## Delaware Serious Crime at-a-Glance, 2009 – 2013




Figure 2: Final Differences in Serious Criminal Offenses, by State and County, 2009 and 2012

Overall, there were about 10,000 fewer reported serious Group A offenses in 2013 compared to 2009, a decline of about 9% (see Table 1 and Figure 1). Two of the four crime categories were notably lower compared to 2009, with the greatest declines for Violent Offenses (around 15%) and Other Property and Social Offenses (around 18%). Drug/Narcotic Offenses were up by about 12%, reflecting a substantial increase in offenses in 2013. Long term trends in offenses since 2002 are also presented in Figure 1. Final differences between 2009 and 2012 for Delaware and its three counties are presented in Figure 2.

Serious Property Offenses was the most frequently reported category of crime in 2013 (34.4%), followed by Other Property and Social Offenses (28.1%), Violent Offenses, (24.4%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (13.2%). These proportions are similar to those from 2009.




Figure 3: Most Common Serious Crimes in Delaware, 2002-2013

The most frequently reported offenses were Larceny; Assault; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Fraud. Assault and Destruction/Damage/Vandalism showed distinct downward trends from 2009 to 2013 (see Figure 3). The number of Drug/Narcotic and Fraud offenses trended upward, while Larceny and Burglary offenses have occurred at variable rates since 2009. Figure 3 also portrays the long term trends in these offenses since 2002.




Figure 4: All Delaware Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013

Based on 2013 preliminary data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to or better than the rates from 2009 through 2012 (see Table 1 and Figure 4). Offenses in the Drug/Narcotic and Violent offense categories continue to be cleared at high rates (96.1% and 76.9% respectively). Overall, more than half of the offenses committed in 2013 were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2002 can be seen in Figure 4.

In general, the number of all arrests followed the trends seen in offenses (see Table 2 and Figure 4). The exception was for Serious Property Offenses, which showed a small increase in arrests from 2009 to 2013 while offenses decreased about 3%. Juvenile arrests showed a sharp downward trend across all four crime categories during this period (a 34% decrease overall). The number of total adult arrests was virtually unchanged, with much variation across the four crime categories. Trends in arrests since 2002 can also be seen in Figure 4.

Preliminary 2013 data indicate that there were fewer violent offenses against law enforcement officers in three of the previous four years (see Table 3). No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2013 and there were 470 violent offenses against officers, a decrease of about 7% compared to 2009, but an increase of 6% compared to 2012. Nearly all violent offenses against law enforcement officers were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Figure 5 illustrates the long term trends in assaults against Delaware law enforcement officers.

Figure 1: Serious Crime in Delaware by Category, 2002-2013




## **New Castle County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2009 – 2013**

Overall, there were about 8,000 fewer reported serious Group A offenses in the county in 2013 compared to 2009, a decline of about 13% (see Table 4 and Figure 6). Three of the four crime categories were notably lower compared to 2009, with the greatest declines for Other Property and Social Offenses (about 24%) and Violent Offenses (about 17%). Drug/Narcotic Offenses increased by around 9%. Long term trends in offenses since 2002 are also presented in Figure 6.

Serious Property Offenses was the most frequently reported category of crime in the county in 2013 (35.5%), followed by Other Property and Social Offenses (28.3%), Violent Offenses, (24.0%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (12.3%). These proportions are similar to those from 2009.




Figure 7: Most Common Serious Crimes in New Castle County, 2002-2013

The most frequently reported offenses in the county were Larceny; Assault; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Fraud. Assault and Destruction/Damage/Vandalism offenses showed distinct downward trends from 2009 to 2013 (see Figure 7). Burglary offenses were down in 2013 after trending upward the previous four years. The opposite pattern occurred for Drug/Narcotic offenses, while Larceny and Fraud offenses occurred at rates similar to 2009. Figure 7 also portrays the long term trends in these offenses since 2002.





Figure 8: All New Castle County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013

Based on 2013 preliminary data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to or better than the rates from 2009 through 2012 (see Table 4 and Figure 8). Offenses in the Drug/Narcotic and Violent offense categories continue to be cleared at high rates (96.2% and 70.9% respectively). Overall, 47.8% of all offenses committed in 2013 were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2002 can be seen in Figure 8.

Total arrests in the county followed the trends seen in offenses (see Table 5 and Figure 8). Juvenile arrests showed a sharp downward trend across all crime categories during this period (a 33% decrease overall). The number of adult arrests decreased about 3%, with much variation across the four crime categories. Trends in arrests since 2002 can also be seen in Figure 8.

Preliminary 2013 data indicate that there were fewer violent offenses against law enforcement officers in the county compared to three of the four prior years (see Table 6). No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2013 and there were 255 violent offenses against officers, an increase of about 16% compared to 2009 and a decrease of about 1% compared to 2012. Nearly all violent offenses against law enforcement officers in the county were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Long term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).

Figure 6: Serious Crime in New Castle County by Category, 2002-2013

## **Kent County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2009 – 2013**

Overall, there were about 1,000 fewer reported serious Group A offenses in Kent County in 2013 compared to 2009, a decline of about 4% (see Table 7 and Figure 9). Two of the four crime categories - Other Property and Social Offenses and Violent Offenses - were notably lower compared to 2009, with declines of around 12% and 9% respectively. Serious Property Offenses decreased slightly (around 1%), while the number of Drug/Narcotic Offenses increased around 17%. Long term trends in offenses since 2002 are also presented in Figure 9.

Serious Property Offenses was the most frequently reported category of crime in Kent County in 2012 (32.8%), followed by Other Property and Social Offenses (26.8%), Violent Offenses, (25.2%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (15.2%). These proportions are similar to those from 2009.




Figure 10: Most Common Serious Crimes in Kent County, 2002-2013

The most frequently reported offenses in the county were Larceny; Assault; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Drug/Narcotic; Fraud; and Burglary. Destruction/ Damage/Vandalism offenses showed a distinct downward trend from 2009 to 2013 (see Figure 10). Drug/Narcotic offenses were higher than in 2009 while the remaining most common offenses showed more mixed patterns since 2009. Figure 10 also portrays the long term trends in these offenses since 2002.





Figure 11: All Kent County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013

Based on 2013 preliminary data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to or better than the rates from 2009 through 2012 (see Table 7 and Figure 11). Offenses in the Drug and Violent offense categories continue to be cleared at high rates (96.0% and 84.2% respectively). Overall, more than 60% of all offenses committed in 2013 had been cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2002 can be seen in Figure 11.

The number of arrests in the county from 2009 through 2013 did not match the trends seen in offenses (see Table 8 and Figure 11). Arrests for Violent and Drug Offenses moved in the same direction as for the corresponding offense categories (lower for Violent Offenses, higher for Drug Offenses). Arrests for Other Property and Social Offenses and Serious Property Offenses moved in the opposite direction compared to these offense categories (offenses decreased but arrests increased). Juvenile arrests from 2009 to 2013 showed a sharp downward trend during this period (a 35% decrease overall). The number of total adult arrests increased around 6% overall. Adult arrests for Drug/Narcotic Offenses increased by 32%, a far larger change than for arrests in the other three categories. Trends in arrests since 2002 can also be seen in Figure 11.

Preliminary 2013 data indicate that there were fewer violent offenses against law enforcement officers in the county compared to three the four prior years (see Table 9). No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2013 and there were 98 violent offenses against officers, a decrease of about 12% compared to 2009 but identical to 2012. Nearly all violent offenses against law enforcement officers in Kent County were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Long term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).

Figure 9: Serious Crime in Kent County by Category, 2002-2013

## Sussex County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2009 – 2013

Overall, there were about 900 fewer reported serious Group A offenses in Sussex County in 2013 compared to 2009, a decrease of about 2% (see Table 10 and Figure 12). Two of the four crime categories - Violent Offenses and Other Property and Social Offenses - decreased compared to 2009 (by about 13% and 5% respectively). The number of Serious Property Offenses increased slightly (about 3%), while the number of Drug/Narcotic Offenses increased around 13%. Long term trends in offenses since 2002 are also presented in Figure 12.

Serious Property Offenses was the most frequently reported category of crime in the county in 2013 (33.2%), followed by Other Property and Social Offenses (28.8%), Violent Offenses, (24.5%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (13.5%). These proportions are similar to those from 2009.




Figure 13: Most Common Serious Crimes in Sussex County, 2002-2013

The most frequently reported offenses in the county were Assault; Larceny; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Fraud. Assault and Destruction/Damage/Vandalism showed distinct downward trends from 2009 to 2013 (see Figure 13). The number of Drug/Narcotic and Fraud offenses trended upward during this period, while Burglary and Larceny offenses showed mixed trends. Figure 13 also portrays the long term trends in these offenses since 2002.





Figure 14: All Sussex County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013

Based on 2013 preliminary data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to or better than the rates from 2009 through 2012 (see Table 10 and Figure 14). Drug and Violent Offenses continue to be cleared at high rates (96.0% and 84.6% respectively). Overall, nearly 60% of all offenses committed in 2013 had been cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2002 can be seen in Figure 14.

The number of all arrests decreased around 3% from 2009 through 2013. Arrests for the four offense categories matched the downward trends in those categories. Juvenile arrests showed a sharp downward trend across all four crime categories during this period (a 39% decrease overall). The number of total adult arrests was up 4%. Of note, Adult arrests for Serious Property and Drug Offenses were up about 20% and 33% respectively. Trends in arrests since 2002 can also be seen in Figure 14.

Preliminary 2013 data indicate there were more violent offenses against law enforcement officers in the county compared to three of the four previous years (see Table 12). No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2013 and there were 117 violent offenses against officers, a decrease of about 24% compared to 2009 but a 33% increase compared to 2012. Most violent offenses against law enforcement officers in Sussex County were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Long term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).

Figure 12: Serious Crime in Sussex County by Category, 2002-2013

## A DETAILED LOOK AT SERIOUS CRIME IN DELAWARE

The following sections provide more detailed information about serious crime in Delaware. Each section has a single topic focus: one of the four crime categories and violent crimes against law enforcement officers. Within each crime category section, statewide data on offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first, followed by the same data for each county. The section on crimes against law enforcement officers presents the state and county data relevant to this topic.

### Notes to the Reader

Data for a calendar year are not considered final for the purposes of the *Crime in Delaware* report until offense counts become sufficiently stable, usually 12-15 months after the end of that year. Therefore, final data are provided for the 2009-2012 period and preliminary data for 2013.

In comparing 2013 with previous years, preliminary data were used for all years (although preliminary counts for 2009-2012 are not provided in this report). Doing so removes the distortion inherent when comparing preliminary and final data. Such distortion can make differences appear larger or smaller than they actually are. Final data are used for comparisons for 2009-2012. Graphic figures that incorporate final and preliminary data are included as appropriate to illustrate trends in the data.

As noted earlier in this report, please use caution when comparing Delaware's data to national data or those for other states. Crime data, particularly crime rates, are best understood in the context of other data.

#### Some important considerations to keep in mind:

- In drawing conclusions about changes between 2013 preliminary data and the final data from prior years, be aware that some crimes (e.g., Fraud, Forgery/Counterfeiting, Arson, Homicide) are more prone to delayed reporting to law enforcement agencies or the filing of charges than other crimes.
- When examining the percentage change in offense data, please use caution in drawing conclusions about those figures without also referring to the offense numbers. Some crimes are reported at such low frequencies (e.g., Homicide, Arson, Extortion, Wire Fraud, Gambling) that the increase or decrease of even one to three cases can translate to a large percentage change that, while seemingly impressive, may not be very meaningful in actuality.

## Delaware Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses were about 15% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The two most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Assault and Robbery – experienced declines of around 14% and 29% respectively. Of special note:

- Preliminary 2013 data indicate the number of Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was nearly identical to the total from 2009, and the second lowest in the five-year period.
- Robbery and Assault with a Firearm offenses appear to be down 34% and 12% compared to 2009, and also experienced substantial decreases compared to 2012.

Most Kidnapping, Assault, and Forcible Sex offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. Less than half of Robbery and Homicide offenses were cleared during that period. Except for Homicides, which take longer to be cleared, Violent Offenses in 2013 were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 13-19 and Figure 15 provide detailed information about Statewide Violent Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 15.

Figure 15: Delaware Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## A Closer Look: Delaware Homicide Victim and Offender Demographics

Delaware homicide victims from 2009 through 2013 have been predominantly males 18 to 50 years old (see Table 20). Around 60% of victims were identified as Black and around 10% Hispanic/Latino. For 2009 through 2012, nearly all known alleged offenders have been male and predominantly aged 18 to 34. Around three-fourths of known offenders during that period have been Black. Offender data for 2013 are not reported due to too few suspect arrests.

## New Castle County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county were about 17% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The two most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Assault and Robbery – experienced declines of around 16% and 28% respectively. Of special note:

- Preliminary 2013 data indicate the number of Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was identical to 2009 and tied for the lowest point for the prior four years.
- Robbery and Assault with a Firearm offenses appear to be down 36% and 24% compared to 2009, and both experienced substantial decreases compared to 2012.

Most Kidnapping and Assault offenses and two-thirds of Forcible Sex Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. Less than half of Robbery and Homicide offenses were cleared during that period. Except for Homicides, which take longer to be cleared, Violent Offenses in 2013 were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 21-27 and Figure 16 provide detailed information about New Castle County Violent Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 16.

Figure 16: New Castle County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Kent County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county were about 9% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The two most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Assault and Robbery – experienced declines of around 11% and 22% respectively. Of special note:

- Preliminary 2013 data indicate the number of Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was higher than 2009 (8 versus 6) and was tied for the highest total for the prior four years.
- Robbery with a Firearm offenses appear to be unchanged compared to 2009 while Assault with a Firearm offenses were up 48%. Compared with 2012, Robbery with a Firearm increased 15% while Assault with a Firearm decreased about 1%.

Most Homicide, Kidnapping, Assault, and Forcible Sex Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. At least half of Robbery offenses were cleared during that period. Most categories of Violent Offenses in 2013 were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 28-34 and Figure 17 provide detailed information about Kent County Violent Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 17.

Figure 17: Kent County Delaware Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2009-2013



## Sussex County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county were slightly lower (about 13%) in 2013 compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Assault, Robbery, and Forcible Sex Offenses varied. The number of Assaults declined 12% compared to 2009, with Robbery declining around 41% during this period. Forcible Sex Offenses increased about 14%. Of special note:

- Preliminary 2013 data indicate the number of Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses (three) was lower the total from each of four prior years.
- Robbery and Assault with a Firearm offenses appear to be down 54% and 19% compared to 2009, and both experienced substantial decreases compared to 2012.

Most Kidnapping, Assault, and Forcible Sex Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. No Homicide offenses and less than half of Robbery offenses were cleared during that period. Most categories of Violent Offenses committed in 2013 were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 35-41 and Figure 18 provide detailed information about Sussex County Violent Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 18.

Figure 18: Sussex County Delaware Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2009-2013



## Delaware Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses were slightly lower (about 3%) in 2013 when compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Larceny, Burglary, and Motor Vehicle Theft - were all different. The number of Larceny offenses was slightly higher (about 1%) compared to 2009. Burglary experienced a decrease of around 10% during this period, while Motor Vehicle Theft decreased substantially, by about 29%. Of special note:

- While the number of Larceny offenses was virtually unchanged:
  - Shoplifting offenses increased by nearly 14% compared to 2009.
  - Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts/Accessories declined by around 34%.
  - Theft From a Building offenses increased 15%

For almost all Serious Property Offense crimes, less than half of offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. However, offenses for all crimes in this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 42-48 and Figure 19 provide detailed information about Statewide Serious Property Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 19.

Figure 19: Delaware Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## New Castle County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were about 6% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Larceny, Burglary, and Motor Vehicle Theft – all decreased but to varying extents. The number of Burglary and Motor Vehicle Theft offenses decreased 13% and 32% compared to 2009. Larceny experienced a slight decrease of around 1% during this period. Of special note:

- Larceny-Shoplifting and Theft From a Building offenses each increased by about 9% compared to 2009.
- Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts/Accessories declined by more than 29%.

For almost all Serious Property Offense crimes, less than one-third of offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. However, offenses for all crimes within this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 49-55 and Figure 20 provide detailed information about New Castle County Serious Property Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 20.

Figure 20: New Castle County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Kent County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were slightly lower (by about 1%) in 2013 when compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Larceny, Burglary, and Motor Vehicle Theft - varied somewhat. The number of Larceny offenses increased around 8% from 2009 to 2013. Burglary and Motor Vehicle Theft offenses decreased 28% and 24% respectively compared to 2009. Of special note:

- Larceny-Shoplifting and Theft From a Building offenses each increased by about 28% compared to 2009.
- Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts/Accessories declined by about 54%.

For almost all Serious Property Offense crimes, less than half of offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. Offenses for all crimes within this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 56-62 and Figure 21 provide detailed information about Kent County Serious Property Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 21.

Figure 21: Kent County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Sussex County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were slightly higher (about 3%) in 2013 when compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Larceny, Burglary, and Motor Vehicle Theft – varied somewhat. The number of Larceny and Burglary offenses experienced increases of around 4% and 7% respectively, from 2009 to 2013. Motor Vehicle Theft offenses decreased 20% compared to 2008. Of special note:

- Larceny-Shoplifting and Theft From a Building offenses increased by about 11% and 18% respectively, compared to 2009.
- Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts/Accessories declined by 38%.

For most Serious Property Offense crimes, less than half of offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. However offenses for almost all crimes in this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 63-69 and Figure 22 provide detailed information about Sussex County Serious Property Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 22.

Figure 22: Sussex County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



Overall, Drug/Narcotic Offenses were about 12% higher in 2013 when compared with 2009. The number of offenses also increased by about 17% from 2012-2013. The patterns of differences for the two crimes in this category of offenses mirrored that for the category.

Figure 23: Delaware Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



Figure 24: New Castle County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



Figure 25: Kent County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Sussex County Drug and Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests

Overall, Drug/Narcotic Offenses in the county were about 13% higher in 2013 when compared with 2009. Offenses related to use/possession increased by about 3%, while those related to the possession of drug equipment increased around 25%. The overall number of offenses increased by about 6% from 2012-2013.

For all Drug/Narcotic crimes, nearly all offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. All Drug/Narcotic offenses in 2013 were cleared at rates comparable to those for the previous four years.

Tables 85-89 and Figure 26 provide detailed information about Sussex County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 26.

Figure 26: Sussex County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Delaware Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Other Property and Social Offenses were around 18% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations – varied somewhat. The number of Fraud offenses was about 6% higher compared to 2009. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism Offenses and Weapon Law Violations decreased substantially since 2009, about 28% and 10% respectively. Of special note:

- While the number of Fraud offenses was up around 6%, compared with 2009:
  - Fraud-False Pretenses/Swindling/Con Games offenses increased by about 35%.
  - Fraud-Credit Card/Automatic Teller Machine offenses increased by around 12%.
  - Fraud-Impersonation offenses decreased by 19%.

Overall, less than half of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. Most crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, the crime with the lowest clearance rate - Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism – accounted for 55% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Almost all crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Figure 27: Delaware Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## New Castle County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Other Property and Social Offenses in the county were around 23% lower in 2013 compared to 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category – Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations - are generally similar to the overall category. Destruction/Damage/Vandalism offenses and Weapon Law Violations decreased substantially since 2009, about 32% and 12% respectively. The number of Fraud offenses was down about 5% compared to 2009. Of special note:

- While the number of Fraud offenses decreased modestly, compared with 2009:
  - Fraud-False Pretenses/Swindling/Con Games offenses increased about 17%.
  - Fraud-Credit Card/Automatic Teller Machine offenses increased around 12%.
  - Fraud-Impersonation offenses decreased by about 27%.

Overall, less than 40% of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. However, most crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, the crime with the lowest clearance rate - Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism – accounts for 59% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. All crimes in this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 99-107 and Figure 28 provide detailed information about New Castle County Other Property and Social Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 28.

Figure 28: NCC Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Other Property and Social Offenses in the county were around 12% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category – Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations – were quite varied. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism offenses decreased about 28% since 2009. The number of Weapon Law Violations was essentially unchanged. The number of Fraud offenses increased 17% compared to 2009. Of special note:

- Examining the increase in Fraud offenses, compared with 2009:
  - Fraud-False Pretenses/Swindling/Con Games offenses increased about 47%.
  - Fraud-Credit Card/Automatic Teller Machine offenses decreased around 9%.
  - Fraud-Impersonation offenses decreased by about 12%.

Overall, just over half of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. Most crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, the crime with the lowest clearance rate - Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism – accounts for 50% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Almost all crimes in this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 108-116 and Figure 29 provide detailed information about Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 29.

Figure 29: Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



## Sussex County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social Offenses in the county was about 5% lower in 2013 when compared with 2009. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses – Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations – varied to a degree. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism offenses and Weapon Law Violations decreased about 16% and 15%, respectively, since 2009. The number of Fraud offenses was up about 21%. Of special note:

- While the number of Fraud offenses was 21% higher, compared with 2009:
  - Fraud-False Pretenses/Swindling/Con Games offenses increased by about 52%.
  - Fraud-Credit Card/Automatic Teller Machine offenses increased by around 16%.
  - Fraud-Impersonation offenses decreased by about 4%.

Overall, less than half of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2013. Most crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, the crime with the lowest clearance rate - Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism – accounts for 53% of the crimes in this offense category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Offenses for all crimes in this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 117-125 and Figure 30 provide detailed information about Sussex County Other Property and Social Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long term trends since 2002 are also presented in Figure 30.

Figure 30: Sussex Cnty. Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013



# LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY STAFFING AND OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED, 2009 – 2013

This final section of the *Crime in Delaware* report examines the staffing trends among Delaware’s law enforcement agencies and violent crimes committed against law enforcement officers.

## Full Time Law Enforcement Officers and Civilian Employees

The number of law enforcement officers and civilians employed in Delaware police departments and agencies totaled 2,367 and 802 in 2013. The law enforcement officer total reflects an increase of 2.6% between 2009 and 2013. The civilian employee total reflects a decrease of 4.1% from 2009.

Municipalities employed approximately half of Delaware’s officers and about one-third of the civilian law enforcement employees. The Delaware State Police was the next largest employer of officers and civilians, followed by the Delaware Attorney General’s Office (see Table 126). Other agencies, such as the Capitol Police, Delaware River and Bay Authority, Amtrak Police, the State Fire Marshal, and enforcement units of various state agencies, employed the remaining officers and civilians. A full list of employee counts by jurisdiction and employee type is located in Table 143 at the end of the *Law Enforcement Agency Staffing and Officers Killed and Assaulted* section.

## Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Delaware

### Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers were higher in 2013.

Assault-related offenses committed against police officers were about 6% lower in 2013 when compared to 2009. However, the number committed in 2013 was about 6% higher than in 2012. **Almost all offenses (96%) had been cleared before the end of 2013.** Assaults against officers continue to be cleared at rates above 95%. Figure 31 illustrates the trends in assaults against officers since 2002.

**No officers were killed in 2013, although about 17% of assault-related offenses resulted in injuries.** Two officers were killed in the line of duty during the 2009 through 2013 period. The percentage of assault-related offenses that resulted in injury is generally consistent with the rates for the four prior years.

**Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles.** Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for about two-thirds of assaults against officers during the 2009 through 2013 period.

**Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers.** During the 2009 through 2013 period, three out of every four assaults against officers involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as a weapon. About one in 20 assaults during this period involved the use of a firearm or a cutting instrument.

Figure 31: Assaults Against Law Enforcement Officers, 2002-2013




Figure 32: Weapons Used Against Law Enforcement Officers 2009-2013




Figure 33: Assaults Against Officers by Type of Activity 2009-2013



**Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county.** From 2009 through 2013, about three out of every four assaults against officers in the county involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as a weapon. About one in 20 assaults during this period involved the use of a firearm or a cutting instrument.

# TECHNICAL APPENDIX

## Detailed Explanation of Clearance Rates

In crime analysis, criminal offenses are considered to be 'solved' through either an arrest or through an alternative means when a suspect(s) has been identified but an arrest cannot be made. When an offense is solved in this way, it is considered to have been 'cleared' for crime reporting purposes. The federal definition of *clearance rate* is the percentage of offenses received that are 'solved' through an arrest or by exceptional means. An offense is 'cleared by arrest' for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to a court for prosecution.

In certain situations, an offender cannot be arrested and formally charged. When this happens, the offense can be cleared by *exceptional means*. This type of clearance can be made if the following four conditions are met:

- the offender can be identified.
- there is enough evidence to support an arrest, make a charge, and turn the offender over to a court for prosecution.
- the offender's exact location is known so that the suspect could be taken into custody immediately.
- there are circumstances outside the control of law enforcement that prohibits the agency from arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.

Examples of exceptional clearances include, but are not limited to:

- the death of the offender;
- confession of the offender under circumstances where prosecution is not possible (e.g., a death bed confession, a confession made while serving a life sentence in another jurisdiction and extradition for trial is not possible);
- the refusal of a victim to cooperate with the prosecution after the offender has been identified;
- denial of extradition (e.g., because the offender committed a crime in another jurisdiction and is being prosecuted for that offense);
- The handling of minor juvenile offenses outside of juvenile court as a matter of publicly accepted police policy.

### ***Clearances involving only persons under 18 years of age***

When a juvenile offender is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, the FBI considers the incident in question to be cleared by arrest, even though a physical arrest may not have occurred. When clearances involve juvenile and adult offenders, those incidents are classified by the FBI as clearances for crimes committed by adults. Since

clearance percentages for crimes involving juvenile offenders only include clearances where an adult was not also involved, juvenile clearance figures should be interpreted with caution – they do not present a definitive picture of juvenile involvement in crime.

### ***Some Factors that Affect Clearance Rates***

*Single versus Multiple Offenses:* In some situations, an offender may commit multiple criminal offenses, either in a single incident of crime or over several incidents. In other situations, two or more people may commit a single offense during a single criminal incident. These situations each work differently with respect to clearances. In the first example, the arrest or identification of that person can clear multiple offenses, while in the second example, the arrest or identification of several persons would only clear one offense.

*The Nature of Some Types of Crime:* Violent criminal offenses (murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault) often undergo a more intensive investigative effort than crimes against property. Also, victims and/or witnesses often identify the perpetrators. Property crimes such as theft from a motor vehicle or vandalism often occur in the absence of witnesses, making it more difficult to identify suspects. Consequently, violent crimes tend to have higher clearance rates than property offenses. Drug/Narcotic offenses clear at high rates because of the nature of those crimes and how they come to the attention of law enforcement agencies.
