*Crime in Delaware: 2009 – 2013* is the official report of serious crimes known to law enforcement from 2009 through 2013. The report provides extensive data about crime at the state and county levels. This supplement continues to reflect an evolving effort within the *Crime in Delaware* reporting process to provide extensive crime data about the City of Wilmington.

The methods used to prepare and analyze Wilmington’s data are the same as those described in the main *Crime in Delaware* report, with one exception – data for Wilmington’s two enforcement agencies - the Wilmington Police Department and the Wilmington Fire Marshall – were first merged before analyzing the city’s data.

In this supplement, tables and figures with summary level data about offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first. These are followed by detailed data tables with counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests (Tables 3-6). Summaries of key findings from each level of data are also included and precede the two sections.

#### **Note to the reader**

Data for a calendar year are not considered final for the purposes of the *Crime in Delaware* report until offense counts become sufficiently stable, usually 12-15 months after the end of that year. Therefore, final data are provided for the 2009-2012 period and preliminary data for 2013. To illustrate long term trends, final data for the years 2002 through 2008 are included in the figures.

## **Wilmington Serious Crime At-a-Glance 2009 – 2013**

Overall, 840 fewer Group A offenses were reported in Wilmington in 2012 compared to 2009, a decline of 5.8%. Preliminary data for 2013 suggest an additional decline of about 1,300 offenses (see Table 1 and Figure 1). Three of the four major crime categories were lower compared to 2009, with the greatest declines for Drug/Narcotic Offenses (about 12.1%) and Other Property and Social Offenses (around 10.4%). The number of Serious Property Offenses were 3.4% higher compared with 2009. Long term trends since 2002 can also be seen in Figure 1. The number of homicides in 2013 (20) is the lowest since 2009.

The most frequently reported offenses in the city were Assault; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Larceny; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Weapon Law Violations. Assault and Destruction/Damage/Vandalism showed distinct downward trends from 2009 to 2013 (see Figure 2). Drug/Narcotic offenses also trended downward since 2009. The patterns for the other three offenses were more mixed. Long term trends since 2002 can be seen in Figure 2.





Figure 3: All Wilmington Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2002-2013

Based on 2013 preliminary data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates generally comparable to or better than the rates from 2009 through 2012 (see Table 1 and Figure 3). Overall, 34% of all offenses committed in 2013 were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Long term clearance trends can also be seen in Figure 3.

The number of juvenile arrests showed a sharp downward trend during this period (a 34% decrease overall). The number of total adult arrests was about 19% lower (see Table 2 and Figure 3). Long term trends in arrests can also be seen in Figure 3.

Figure 1: Serious Crime in Wilmington by Category, 2002-2013



Figure 2: Most Common Serious Crimes in Wilmington, 2002-2013

## A Detailed Look at Crime in Wilmington

The following section provides more detailed information about serious crime in Wilmington. Included is a summary of notable findings for specific crimes within the four crime categories (Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Serious Property Offenses) along with tables that provide detailed counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests.

### Notes to the Reader

Data for a calendar year are not considered final for the *Crime in Delaware* report until offense counts become sufficiently stable, usually 12-15 months after the end of that year. Therefore, final data are provided for the 2009-2012 period and preliminary data for 2013.

Graphic figures that incorporate final and preliminary data are included as appropriate to illustrate trends in the data.

Please use caution when comparing Wilmington's data to data for other jurisdictions and geographic areas. Crime data are best understood in the context of other data.

#### **An important consideration to keep in mind:**

- In drawing conclusions about changes between 2013 preliminary data and the final data from prior years, be aware that some crimes (e.g., Fraud, Forgery/Counterfeiting, Arson, Homicide) are more prone to delayed reporting to law enforcement agencies or the filing of charges than other crimes.

### ***Violent Offenses***

- The number of Criminal Homicides (20) was the fourth lowest during report period.
- Kidnapping/Abduction and Forcible Sex Offenses (both lower frequency crimes) were more than 40% lower in 2013 as compared to 2009 (which were also the highs for the period).
- Assault and Robbery offenses were about 15% and 19% lower in 2013, compared to 2009.
- Assault and Robbery offenses that involved the use of firearm were about 8% and 24% lower in 2013 compared to 2009, with the former category increasing by about 20% since 2011. While not reported in the NIBRS data, most criminal homicides in 2013 involved the use of a firearm.

### ***Serious Property Offenses***

- Burglary offenses were about 8% higher compared to 2009, but about 20% lower than 2010 through 2012.
- The number of all Larceny offenses was up about 3%. Within that subcategory of crime:
  - The number of Theft from a Building offenses was about 6% higher than 2009, but equivalent to 2010 through 2012.
  - The number of Theft from a Motor Vehicle offenses was about 5% higher than 2009, and higher than three of four years preceding 2013.
- The number of Motor Vehicle Theft offenses was down about 26% compared to 2009.

### ***Drug/Narcotic Offenses***

- Overall, the number of offenses in this category in 2013 was about 30% lower than 2009. Drug Equipment offenses were about 50% lower during this period.

### ***Other Property and Social Offenses***

- The number of Fraud offenses was about 39% lower in 2013 compared to 2009. This decrease was largely driven by a substantial decrease in Impersonation offenses (about 56%).
- The number of Destruction, Damage, Vandalism of Property offenses in 2013 was the lowest of the report period and reflects a roughly 18% decrease since 2009.
- Weapon Law Violations were about 6% lower compared to 2009 and the second lowest number of the report period.
